



#### **Planting**

- Planting of small tube stock seedlings is the most reliable method.
- A planting density of approximately one plant per m<sup>2</sup> should be used.
- Seedlings should be planted at the bottom of a basin shaped hole with dimensions 60cm across and at least 30 cm deep (see adjacent diagram).
   The hole should be watered prior to planting with at least 5l of water containing wetting agent.
- Holes can be made using a shovel or mechanized using a purpose designed auger (see attached details)
- When planting seedlings, the roots should be inserted below the 30cm deep bottom of the hole in a zone where the soil has been pre-loosened.
- Slow-release fertilizer pellets specified for use with native plants should be applied near the plants.
- Coarse mulch should be used both within and between plants (see photo).
- Water at least monthly (5l into each basin holes) from November to April in the year following planting.





#### Mechanical hole preparation


Hole preparation requirements have been best met by using a purpose designed auger and drill unit.

The auger is a Stihl 131 professional single-operator earth auger and is combined with a auger fitting designed by Cottesloe Coastcare (Peter Ewing) - pictured and see:

The Auger design has been further tweaked and version 3 was used by us and contractors for the 2021 planting season.

















